What do the following boating related acronyms stand for :-


1. CRT – Canal and River Trust

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### Round 3 Locks


You arrive at Stamp End Lock from Burton Waters heading to Washingborough. The last boater has left the lock as it should be with all gates and paddles closed. The lock is empty.

Put the following in the correct sequence.

1. Moor at top landing pontoon and let off crew. (b)
2. Insert key into control panel and lift cover (c)
3. Open guillotine gate a little to let water in (a)
4. Wait for water to rise (l)
5. Open guillotine gate fully (d)
6. Untie and take boat into lock (f)
7. Moor to bollards at the side of the lock ready to let out rope (h)
8. Close guillotine gate (j)
9. Open paddles (i)
10. Wait for water to fall (n)
11. Open Mitre Gates (e)
12. Release ropes and take boat out of lock (o)
13. Moor to bottom pontoon ready to collect crew. (m)
14. Close Mitre Gates (k)
15. Close paddles (p)
16. Close control panel and remove key (q)
17. Collect crew untie and head down stream (g)

*There are some small variations to the above which work and are safe and these have been marked as correct*

### Round 4 Heading Down the Trent

On a day in **July**, you are heading to Keadby from Torksey in a slow boat, you decide you will leave Torksey one hour before high tide there and push the tide towards Gainsborough so you can then ride the Ebb and be sure to reach Keadby before the tide turns again. High Water at Torksey is 3 hours 45 mins later than at Hull Albert Dock. High Tide at Albert dock is 09:25GMT.

What time do you plan to leave Torksey ? **13:10 BST**

### Round 5 An underwater obstacle

A boat leaving Elisions Quay unfortunately sinks due south of Harbour Lights (you can speculate which boat it may be). The Commodore asks you to put up cardinal marks to ensure other members don't hit the sunken boat.

**Cardinal Marks are used to identify hazards such as sunken boats the triangles indicate where in relation to the mark the hazard is. A north cardinal mark (Triangle pointing up on top of a triangle pointing up) is placed to the north of the hazard, south cardinal to the south etc.** Often only one mark is placed to identify a hazard so in the real world don't expect to see four.

Match the locations with the marks

1. Triangle pointing down on top of a triangle pointing up (West) - Towards the Marina visitors pontoon (d)
2. Triangle pointing up on top of a triangle pointing up (North) - Towards Harbour Lights (a)
3. Triangle pointing down on top of a triangle pointing down (South) - Towards the houses opposite Harbour Lights (b)
4. Triangle pointing up on top of a triangle pointing down (East) - Towards Ellison's Quay (c)


