For a few days away, I like to cruise to Kirkstead Bridge, you can usually find a free mooring space. Here you have access to Woodhall Spa which is an interesting village to explore. Independent shops, good restaurants and the Kinema for an old-fashioned trip to see a film. Walk to see the remains of the abbey or hop a bus for a trip to Boston. Lorenzo's and Tea House in the Woods are amongst the many good restaurants.

I find Starbrite Black Streak Remover excellent when cleaning outside of boat. Use on those areas where there has been some rubbing or water-run staining. It is not cheap, but you only need to use a small amount.
